The focus of this initiative is to work with Inuit that have come in conflict with the law; helping navigate them through culturally specific resources and supports. The Restorative Justice Initiative adheres to the 8 Inuit Qaujimagatuqangit guiding principles:

Inuuqatigiitsiarniq- Respecting others, relationships and caring for people.

Tunnganarniq- Fostering good spirit by being open, welcoming and inclusive.

Pijitsirniq- Serving and providing for family and/or community.

Aajiiqatigiinni- Decision making through discussion and consensus.

Pilimmaksarniq- Development of skills through practice, effort and action.

Piliriqatigiinni/Ikajuqtigiingniq- Working together for a common cause.

Qanuqtuurniq- Being innovative and resourceful

Avatittinnik Kamatsiarniq- Respect and care for the land, animals and the environment.
