Celebrating over 30 years of serving the urban Inuit community in Ottawa and across Canada, **Tungasuvvingat Inuit (TI)** is a one-stop resource centre to meet the rapidly growing, complex and evolving needs of the Inuit of Ontario. Deeply responsive to the needs of the community, TI has expanded beyond offering social and cultural programming to include health services through the formation of the Akausivik Inuit Health Centre, and the soon to re-open Mamisarvik Healing Centre. Recognizing the need to effect systematic change, TI is also actively using advocacy to increase awareness of Inuit-specific needs with partners including the government of Ontario, The Royal Ottawa Mental Health Centre and working with provincial and federal departments on the Ontario Indigenous Children and Youth Strategy.

**Tungasuvvingat Inuit** is now looking for a new **Director, Healing and Wellness** to work collaboratively with other members of the management team to deliver responsive and effective programming to the urban Inuit community. Overseeing the day-to-day operation of TI's Healing and Wellness-oriented programming, the incumbent works with and is supported by all departments within TI. Reporting to, and working closely with the Executive Director, the new Director, Healing and Wellness will work with internal and external stakeholders to ensure effective and comprehensive client service delivery, and represent TI at the municipal, provincial, and federal level.

As the ideal candidate, you have extensive experience leading in a community-based or health services organization with a high level of program management. You are immediately recognized for your above average inter-personal skills and your ability to build effective working relationships with staff, management, clients, external stakeholders, and the urban Inuit community - all whilst being guided by traditional Inuit principles. As TI is focused on serving the urban Inuit community, Inuktitut language skills, Inuit heritage and previous experience working in an Aboriginal organization are definite assets, while knowledge of Inuit culture, values, and traditional Inuit healing methods are essential to effectively serve in this role.
