



Treatment Manager, Mamisarvik Healing Centre

Celebrating over 30 years of serving the urban Inuit community in Ottawa and across Canada, **Tungasuvvingat Inuit (TI)** is a one-stop resource centre to meet the rapidly growing, complex and evolving needs of the Inuit of Ontario. Deeply responsive to the needs of the community, TI has expanded beyond offering social and cultural programming to include health services through the formation of the Akausivik Inuit Health Centre, and the soon to re-open Mamisarvik Healing Centre.

When the word “Mamisarvik” (which means “A Place of Healing”) is spoken, many Inuit immediately break into a broad smile. A critical branch of TI, the Mamisarvik Healing Centre is an Inuit-specific, 12-bed, 53-day, co-ed, residential and day treatment program for those aged 18 and older struggling with trauma and addiction issues. It participates in more than 60 partnerships with other organizations and government bodies including The Royal Ottawa Mental Health Centre, the Canadian Centre on Substance Abuse, Ontario Aboriginal HIV/AIDS Strategy, the Southern Ontario Aboriginal Diabetes Initiative, and Cancer Care Ontario.

Tungasuvvingat Inuit is now looking for a new **Treatment Manager** to lead the Mamisarvik healing centre as it re-opens its services. Managing the day-to-day operation, including supervision and scheduling of staff involved in direct and indirect services to clients, the incumbent reports to the Director, Healing and Wellness, TI management, and external stakeholders to ensure the delivery of holistic and effective client services.

As the ideal candidate, you have extensive experience in the management of health services organizations, ideally with a diploma or degree in business or public administration, social work, or a demonstrably-related field. Your interpersonal skills are exemplary, with a proven track record of managing program staff and fostering a collaborative, respectful, and ethical work environment. In the face of stressful or delicate situations, you are calm and adept at finding solutions. As TI is focused on serving the urban Inuit community, Inuktitut language skills, Inuit heritage and previous experience working in an Aboriginal organization are definite assets, while knowledge of Inuit culture, values, and traditional Inuit healing methods are essential to effectively serve in this role.
